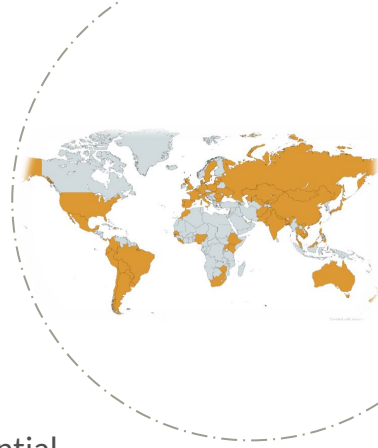


Teach For All

Over the next decade, the Teach For All's [Future of Work Initiative](#) will catalyze a global movement of educators, industry leaders, education system leaders, and communities closely collaborating to ensure that all students have access to resources and locally rooted learning opportunities that prepare them to grow as leaders who thrive in future careers in a rapidly evolving economy.

Since 2023, we implemented the Future of Work Initiative in, enabled by **16 corporate partnerships**, reaching more than 2,100 participants with programs in the following content areas—**Career Education, Financial Education, and STEM**—identified by our partners and stakeholders as critical to preparing students for the world of work. Organizational priorities

The Future of Work Initiative adopts a multistakeholder approach, involving key stakeholders, in an inclusive platform where all voices are valued, and focuses on three key priorities:

- Supporting teachers to develop students holistically by facilitating the global Future of Work, STEM, and Financial Education communities of practice and learning experiences for educators to share resources and learn best practices.
- Connecting students to opportunities to learn about industries and future careers, and expand their access to career readiness education, STEM, digital skills, and financial education.
- Spreading Future of Work solutions for system-level impact by elevating locally rooted knowledge to contribute to the global discussion on how to reorient education towards students' holistic development and prepare them for future careers.
